Chapter-1 Introduction

During the ruling of the Baro-Bhuiyans, this region was occupied by Chand Ray, the Zamindar of Bikrampur and so no f Kedar Ray. According to historian J.M. Sengupta, the region was named Chandpur, following the name of Chand Ray. On the other hand, others say that the name of this region comes from Chand Faqir of Purindapur mahalla of Chandpur, Bangladesh. It is said that an administrator named Shah Ahmed Chand came here from Delhi in the fifteenth century and established a river port. In 1779 AD, Major James Rennel, a British surveyor, drew a map of Bengal during the British rule and include dan obscure town called Chandpur. At that time, there were offices and courts at a place called Narsinghpur (which has now sunk) south of Chandpur. The confluence of the Padma and the Meghna was about 60 miles south-west of the present place. This area has now disappeared due to the game of breaking the Meghna River.

The first Chandpur subdivision was formed in 1878 as a result of administrative reorganization during the British rule. On 1 October 1896, Chandpur city was declared as a municipality. It was declared as Chandpur district on 15 February 1984.

The Geological formation of Chandpur was taken place in Pleistocene and Holocene Era. Geographical history of Chandpur was found in the East-Indian country-map of Perguitar. In the map, south to Bangladesh, Sagornooper, to the north Pragjyotish and the Eastern plain beside hills was known as 'Kiratas.' The then Red River (Brammhaputra of today) born ealluvial soil contributed the formation of 'Kiratas' and Comilla was under it. That is Chandpur was under 'Kiratas.' In the map of Tomas Water, a land named 'Srikhetra' was shown to the south of the combined course of both the Titas and Gomati (probably). It is guessed that Chandpur and the west part of Noakhali were under 'Srikhetra.' In the map of Jean de Brosse in 1560, 'Tropo' was shown by river banks. This 'Tropo' was actually Tripura or Comilla region. That is, Chandpur was a part of Tripura. In the map of Portuguese sailor Sans on de Abevilin1652, Bander, a place was marked where there was a big river port. This port was actually Chandpur. In 1779, English surveyor Major James Renneldrewa map where not only Tripura, but also Chandpur and Comilla were rightly spotted.

Brief History of PuranBazar Degree College

Puranbazar Degree College is one of the best colleges of Chandpur district with a tradition of 41 years in continuation of its past traditions written in history. The college has a rich and glorious history. Chandpur, known as the 'Assam-Bengal Gateway', is a prosperous Padma Meghna town ship in Bangladesh. Education, culture, trade and commerce have been able to play a unique role. They have considered education as a stepping stone for the development of the nation. Based on the consensus of the businessmen of Puran Bazar, the then Sub-Divisional Administrator Mr. Habibur Rahman announced the auspicious opening of the college through a meeting at the Puran Bazar Madhusudan High School grounds on October 26, 1981. The meeting was attended by Mr. Jahangir Akhand Salim, Mr. Mizanur Rahman Patwari, Mr. Abu Taher Akhand, Mr. Abdul Karim Patwari, Mr. Dr. MA Ghafoor, Mr. MA Masud Bhuiyan, Mr. AWM Toaha Miah Principal Chandpur Government College, Mr. Captain Karim Uddin Principal Chandpur Government Women's College along with all levels of businessmen of Puran Bazar. Puran Bazar Madhusudan High School College was started in 1981-1982 academic year with 48 students. In the beginning, the journey started with the science and business education department of the college. A government college well as a private college goes ahead with its activism. In 1983, the first female students from the college participated in the Higher Secondary Examination. In 1985 Comilla Education Board secured second place in commerce and eighth place from the college and furthered the goal of establishing the college. Since its establishment, Comilla Education

Board has been able to highlight its brilliant position by securing a place in the merit list. Two people from this institution in 1994, One in 1996, two in 1997, two in 1998, four in 1999, two in 2000, four in 2001 and ten students in 2002 have been able to place in the merit list of Comilla Education Board. In 1992, the college was upgraded to the undergraduate level under Chittagong University due to the special need of the time and to expand the path of higher education to the children of the people of the southern region of Chandpur. Honors courses in Bengali, English, Accountancy, Management, Political Science, Social Work and Economics have been introduced in the college with the strong efforts of Mr. Jahangir Akhand Salim Sahib.Chandpur-3 Constituency Honorable Member of Parliament and College Governing Board President Dr. The progress of the college continues through an academic friendly and efficient management committee under the chairmanship of Dipu Moni.

- Self-Control: Students are constantly encouraged by the teachers to develop the ability of controlling themselves and regulate the thought sand behavior in the face of temptations and impulses as it is an executive function, it is necessary for achieving specific goals.

Key Achievement sand Highlights of the Year of the Departments

7 out of 23 departments of the college individually arranged national& international webinars focusing on academic issues and commemorating the century birth anniversary of the father of the nation, Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman. Due to COVID-19 situation, all the departments continued their academic activities through virtual platform.

Highlights of Student Activities of the Year:

Academic:

- **Classroom Performance:** Classroom performance is an example of student response system. It is the key of learning. It allows the students to take part actively in the process of learning. Still our students are less inquisitive, but we have been trying to encourage them asking questions which is most important factor of inquisitiveness. And students are gradually responding to this system. We have succeeded a lot in doing so.
- Sitting for examinations (Internal/External): Sitting for examination is the conventional feedback of learning system. Though it is directly related to the academic recognition, students are very keen to attend all kinds of feedback on examination performance. Here the participation of the learners is almost 100%.

- Sports: Can not be arranged due to the pandemic situation.
- Cultural Activities: Cannot be arranged due to the pandemic situation.
- Social Activities: The Red Crescent arranged a blood donation camp in the last fiscal year. They also distributed warm clothes and blankets among the

poor people in the last winter. Rover Scouts, Rangers and BNCC unit also play roles to keep the campus clean once a month, take part disciplinary activities and march past during the celebration of the national days.

• Civic Engagement: in the last year, our students volunteered in some social awareness programs like health, human rights, enfranchisement and eve teasing issues.

Key Achievements and Highlights of the Year of Institutional Development Grants (IDG)

Only 8 OTM packages, namely, G-1, G-2, G-3, G-4, G-5, G-7, G-8, G-10 was initiated through e-GP system. The IDG Management Team successfully signed all of the 8 contracts and out of them 10 packages were full completed and 2 package are (G-6) and (G-9) is carried over to the FY 2023-24. The college also got IT equipment such as Desktop & Laptop computers, Projectors etc. procured by PMU as central procurement.

With the implementation of the packages, all of the seven (07) departments, central library, and teachers' lounge got the full facilities of drinking water. The surveillance system has been strengthen by the use of CC Camera and etc. 2 Modern computer labs has been established at the Department of Mathematics & Geography and all the science laboratories has been equipped with modern equipment, apparatus & chemicals. Computers labs and central library have been renovated & air conditioned. 2 generators have been setup for continual power supply in College. The teaching learning environment has been improved by renovation and setting up adequate number of lights and fans in 22 classrooms. All of departments, office, libraries, and 11 classrooms have been furnished with modern furniture such as Steel Almirah, File Cabinet, Multipurpose Self, Computer Table & Chairs, Visitor Chair, High and Low Bench etc.
